Teaching Strategies

At Mountain View High School language is taught using TPRS (Teaching Proficiency through Reading and Storytelling) and CI (Comprehensible Input) methods. TPRS emphasizes mastery and proficiency in the language rather than short-term memorization of vocabulary and grammar rules. Research has shown that students who acquire language through TPRS/ CI methods score com-I petitively on national assessment and college placement exams. (Cynthia Hitz) This course is an intermediate course to the Spanish language. It is taught through the skills of listening, reading, writing, and speaking. Students will learn to understand the Spanish language as it is spoken at an intermediate level and to communicate with simple verbal or written re-
